**2. Hazards Identification**

**Emergency overview** Aerosol. CONTENTS UNDER PRESSURE.  
 Harmful in contact with eyes.

**Potential health effects**

**Routes of exposure** Eye contact. Skin contact. Ingestion.

**Eyes** Contact may irritate or burn eyes.

**Skin** Frequent or prolonged contact may defat and dry the skin, leading to discomfort and dermatitis.

**Inhalation** Intentional misuse by concentrating and inhaling the product can be harmful or fatal.

**Ingestion** Exposure by ingestion of an aerosol is unlikely. Components of the product may be absorbed into the body by ingestion. May cause delayed lung damage. Ingestion can cause gastrointestinal irritation, nausea, vomiting and diarrhea.

**Target organs** Central nervous system. Lungs.

**Chronic effects** Unconsciousness. Conjunctiva. Cyanosis (blue tissue condition, nails, lips, and/or skin). May cause central nervous system disorder (e.g., narcosis involving a loss of coordination, weakness, fatigue, mental confusion and blurred vision) and/or damage. Frequent or prolonged contact may defat and dry the skin, leading to discomfort and dermatitis. May cause delayed lung injury.

**Signs and symptoms** Discomfort in the chest. Narcosis. Cyanosis (blue tissue condition, nails, lips, and/or skin). Coughing. Jaundice. Defatting of the skin. Skin irritation.

**4. First Aid Measures**

**First aid procedures**

**Eye contact** Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. Get medical attention if irritation develops and persists.

**Skin contact** Wash off with warm water and soap. Get medical attention if irritation develops and persists.

**Inhalation** Move to fresh air. Get medical attention if symptoms persist.

**Ingestion** If material is ingested, immediately contact a poison control center.

**Notes to physician** Keep victim warm. Keep victim under observation. Symptoms may be delayed.

## 5. Fire Fighting Measures

<b>Flammable properties</b>	Vapor or gas may spread to distant ignition sources and flash back. Runoff to sewer may cause fire or explosion hazard.
<b>Extinguishing media</b>	
<b>Suitable extinguishing media</b>	Water fog. Foam. Dry chemical powder. Carbon dioxide (CO <sub>2</sub> ).
<b>Protection of firefighters</b>	
<b>Protective equipment and precautions for firefighters</b>	In case of fire and/or explosion do not breathe fumes. Containers should be cooled with water to prevent vapor pressure build up.

## 6. Accidental Release Measures

<b>Methods for containment</b>	Stop leak if you can do so without risk. Move the cylinder to a safe and open area if the leak is irreparable. Stop the flow of material, if this is without risk.
<b>Methods for cleaning up</b>	Should not be released into the environment. Use a non-combustible material like vermiculite, sand or earth to soak up the product and place into a container for later disposal.  Small Spills: Wipe up with absorbent material (e.g. cloth, fleece). Clean surface thoroughly to remove residual contamination.

## 7. Handling and Storage

<b>Handling</b>	Pressurized container: Do not pierce or burn, even after use. Do not smoke while using or until sprayed surface is thoroughly dry. Do not use if spray button is missing or defective. Do not re-use empty containers. Do not get this material in contact with eyes. Avoid breathing dust/fume/gas/mist/vapors/spray. Avoid contact with skin.
<b>Storage</b>	Contents under pressure. Do not puncture, incinerate or crush. The pressure in sealed containers can increase under the influence of heat. Do not handle or store near an open flame, heat or other sources of ignition. Avoid exposure to long periods of sunlight. Store in cool place. Keep container dry. Keep out of the reach of children.
